

What is the Unified Platform for 22?

As an activist for over 25 years, I ended up advocating on a variety of issues and was horrified to see elected officials promise us one thing, but at the last minute veer off and engage in actions which stood in direct opposition to their words. The leadership of both parties were regularly inaccessible.

A 2 party system has unfortunately led towards oligarchy as corporate interests have bought off the leadership in both major parties. What this means is that we are stuck with 2 corporate choices and an out of control government that rewards businesses not for performance but for being connected to the right people. Some industries like banking are considered, "Too big to fail." while, some industries such as the music industry receive no such rescue.

Due to the census occurring in 2020 the 2022 races will be uniquely vulnerable due to redistricting.

The plan was to gather as many 3rd party, and Independent candidates as possible as well as invite sympathetic Democrats and Republicans to come together and pass a non-corporately influenced platform that we can all agree on. While we will not exclude the 2 major parties candidates from participating this is a 3rd party/independent initiative. Let there be no doubt about that. The leadership of both parties are obviously corrupt and not to be trusted.

From my time being sympathetic to third parties for decades I, as many others, found that third parties suffered from all the same problems as the large parties. The leadership eventually became immune to the concerns, agency, and sacrifice of the working members.

While the goal of this program was to

"Create a unified platform which takes on the corporate duopoly/monopoly and force a dialogue on issues they try to suppress! "

The fact of the matter is that verifiably through publication of participants throughout the process, that the only candidates to participate in this program, oddly enough, were a candidate running on the Democratic party line and a Republican as well. Absolutely zero independents or third parties participated in the final vote to establish the validity of this document. Even though the language and spirit of this program was designed directly to help them.

## How it Worked

Every single candidate in the 2022 election running for US Senate or House of Representatives as well as every single state governor were personally contacted and the public was also invited to participate.

Besides adding proposals to the form linked above, a series of discussion panels were held with candidates across the nation. These candidates included a coalition of candidates from over fifteen states and representatives from the Republicans, Democrats, Greens, Libertarians and independents.

## UP22 report

Even though this program was definitively described as a 3rd party focused effort, in the end the voting participants from the candidate side of things were a Democrat and a Republican. And that's it. Two candidates. While the proposals were made by a wide range of candidates with differing levels of participation, in the end I'm pretty sure that the complete lack of press coverage of this event discouraged voting.

However, of historical significance in the 22 elections we have several unanimous agreements between members of these parties.

## BREAKDOWN OF PROPOSALS BY CATEGORY

Out of the 216 total questions the breakdown was as follows

The re-calculation of the total from the subtotals serve as a double check and reaffirms the original calculation.

Overall approximately 46.0% of proposals received unanimous support.

Personal remarks:

Proposals that received support were proposals focusing on bringing increased fairness to the system and to provide for more rights for people in the criminal justice system. There was a unified reluctance to engage gun control measures which was unexpected

From the economic reform proposals we achieved unanimous agreement on the following 21 out of 45. In reality this is 20 out of 44 since a proposal was duplicated. (appx. 45.5% agreement):

1. Expand apprenticeship programs to teach trades. - - proposed by Susan Buchser-Lochocki (R) West Virginia former Green Presidential candidate now running for U.S. House of Representatives <http://www.susan4usa.com>

2 proposals were unanimously rejected. They are as follows:

1. Withdraw investor's ability to invest in the market without liability Increased power should come with increased responsibility, not less responsibility. Replace limited liability corporations with full liability corporations. We must all be accountable for our actions at all times. - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>

2. Pay off interest payments on student debt by selling off of properties that schools own that have nothing to do with education and also through seizure of the massive endowments that these schools have accrued while accepting US taxpayer money. #### Personal Remarks:

There were unanimous agreements to exert greater control of citizens over the financial system and to limit the power of corporate trusts which have established monopolies over many aspects of our industry.

From the medical reform proposals we achieved unanimous agreement on the following 8 out of 19 proposals (appx. 42.1% agreement):

1. Amend air carriers access act so that the disabled may fly without hassle for things such as guide animals. Airlines must immediately pay to replace any mobility device they damage or destroy. - proposed by Marc Safman (D) co-founder and board member of New York DeafBlind Advocates

2. Good faith interactive process to give guidance to businesses and protect disabled workers. - proposed by Marc Safman (D) co-founder and board member of New York DeafBlind Advocates

3. End the failed "War on Drugs." John Oliver did a superb video on March 28, 2022 on Harm Reduction. [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RMpCGD7b\\_H4](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=RMpCGD7b_H4). This bill would decriminalize all drugs and take the drug trade out of the hands of organized crime. Addicts would be able to walk into a clinic and get a specific amount of the drug, uncontaminated by fentanyl or other poisons. Many countries do this, and the overdose death rates go way down. At minutes 12:00 to 14:00, John Oliver answers the concern that addictive drug use will be encouraged. It won't. People who use the Overdose Prevention Centers are

4. Eliminate the marketing of drugs to consumers. The U.S. is unique amongst developed nations in its decision to allow greater amounts of drug marketing than in other countries. Drug marketing attempts to create a bias in the mind of the audience to drive consumption not to educate and inform. Let the truth be published and give patients the information they need. Not a song and dance. - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>

5. Doctors and executives got too greedy and formed a predatory aristocracy. Doctors and executives and those connected to them should face a much higher level of scrutiny when put into regulatory positions. If they have not sacrificed to take on the worst medical system in the developed world regarding cost vs. outcomes then they cannot be trusted. Rather victims of the medical industry should be prioritized for regulatory roles. - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>

6. Immediately expand Medicaid to cover hearing, magnification and mobility aids.- proposed by Marc Safman (D) co-founder and board member of New York DeafBlind Advocates

The following proposals were unanimously rejected

1. I support Medicare 4 all and a complete elimination of the private health care industry. - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>

#### Personal Remarks:

Unsurprisingly we did not get an agreement on abortion issues. Of note there was unanimous support for Medicare 4 all, but not as proposed by Jayapal, but rather a previous formulation. Furthermore there was a unanimous rejection of Medicare 4 all in response to another formulation.

From the environmental reform proposals we achieved unanimous agreement on the following 11 out of 22 proposals (50% agreement):

1. To reduce the inefficiencies of shipping we can promote local businesses and locally produced food by taxing the shipping activities of Amazon which have served to disrupt the pay rate of delivery drivers working for UPS, Fed Ex and so forth and encourage seasonal diet changes more aligned with locally produced food djelf7 NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>
2. Give farms and agricultural producers the best financial terms to prioritize this essential industry. We should encourage cooperative models to assure the participants agency in the process. - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>
3. The government cannot target poor and minority communities for waste disposal and toxic facilities. Tracking of health problems caused by the displacement of waste and toxic materials will be linked back to the communities that benefitted and they will be assessed the costs of fixing the situation. - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>
4. Restrict the use of oppressive patents used by agricultural companies like Monsanto. - proposed by Marc Safman (D) co-founder and board member of New York DeafBlind Advocates
5. Develop geothermal energy - proposed by Susan Buchser-Lochocki (R) West Virginia former Green Presidential candidate now running for U.S. House of Representatives <http://www.susan4usa.com>
6. We must force a decoupling of the industrial interests from regulatory bodies and academic funding when there are clear conflicts of interest. Industry creates an economic advantage towards commercial solutions against which the unfunded truth cannot compete. Comfortable bureaucrats and academics have been proven to be unable to hold the industry accountable. So they should be barred from regulatory position unless they have made significant sacrifices to hold the industry accountable. - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>
7. The Right to Water - We cannot allow localities to sell off water to industry without assuring that all of its participants have access to at least a minimal amount of water first. Proposals that were unanimously rejected were as follows:

1. Illegalize meat as a product of consumption - djelf7 NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>

Personal remarks: Unexpectedly nuclear power got unanimous support. Agricultural issues and water rights received support as did more openness and transparency regarding our food supply. Unfortunately animal rights activists may be dissatisfied with some of the rejected proposals. I encourage them to participate more in the future so that their voices can also be heard.

From our Right to Repair reform proposals we achieved unanimous agreement on the following 1 out of 5 proposals (50% agreement):

Serialization is a way that manufacturers use to “lock down” devices so that they are specific to the individual device to literally prevent users from being able to swap out and repair parts in order to monopolize control of their product. Modifications to products to extend control of a device at the expense of the end consumer must come with clear labelling that identifies the nature of these modifications. Rather than allowing the industry to self police itself or for corruptible regulators and officials to design / approve labels it is proposed that repair shops and end users who have suffered as a result of these practices be given the responsibility for designing labelling addressing this issue. - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>

Personal remarks: Many of the failures to achieve a unanimous agreement here were due to abstentions possibly due to the technical nature of this topic.

From our Gender related proposals we achieved unanimous agreement on the following 1 out of 10 proposals (10% agreement):

No proposals were agreed upon. Proposals were only unanimously rejected and they are as follows:

Institute a government of, for, and by women, and give it all authority over abortion, immigration, and any other factors affecting human population count in the nation. Only women can have the moral authority to ask, demand, or require that other women limit their birthing. – William Waugh <gpp5cp9wfh@liamekaens.com> citizen-activist

Ban trans people from sports - proposed by djelf7 (G,R,D,L,I) NYC's #1 street activist <http://www.djelf7.com>

Personal remarks: The decision to reject banning trans people from sports was part of a series of proposals with differing levels of participation permitted for trans people. While "allowing trans people to participate in the sport of their choosing" received a rejection and an abstain.

"Allowing trans people to participate in sports but defined in their gender by a criteria that does not follow either extreme" received an approval and an abstain vote which implies that some level of compromise may be achievable on this topic. Personally I am quite pleased that we have a unanimous rejection of the proposal to ban trans people from sports.

From our Corporate and governmental accountability related proposals we achieved unanimous agreement on the following 1 out of 6 proposals (appx. 16.7% agreement):

Review the length of the election cycle (It's probably too long) - proposed by Brian (I), North Carolina former legislator from NH <https://www.anamericanunion.com/>

Personal remarks: It was a goal of this platform to address corporate and governmental accountability issues. Many of the proposals were previously covered in the economic reform proposals section

From our military accountability related proposals we achieved unanimous agreement on the following 6 out of 18 proposals (appx. 33.3% agreement):

(as a quick example if I count the numbers 2 through 4 even though if I subtract 4 from 2, the numbers 2 THROUGH 4 are actually 3. {2,3,4} This is because when measuring distances we usually start with our first mark being at 0 and not 1. Since the first number of this set is not 0, it must be accounted for. So there is really a total of 216 questions total

#### Summary and personal thoughts:

This program was explicitly advertised as a 3rd party independent effort. However when it came time for actual participation, unfortunately, as is often the case mirrored in my activism we end up relying on the duopoly. Yes, I have been particularly critical of Justice Democrats. However, I would like to also point out that I have worked with Jamal Bowman on disability issues and that it looks like he may be providing assistance again on the topic of public housing. AOC has helped feed the hungry with Hungry Monk, and I am scheduled to engage in voter registration and public housing advocacy along with potentially some members of DSA and Sunrise. When it comes time to helping the communities that I serve, those who do not get help, those who are underserved, there are individuals in all groups that are ready to step up and try to positively impact the world.

But the leadership of every organization despite their claimed values are not interested in working together. Furthermore, the press has refused to help promote unity, and this is the evidence.

If you are committed to achieving actual change. Now you can see how things are. The press and party leaders work together to form an aristocracy where honest grassroots activists are excluded. Although my document recognizes Andrew Yang and gives credit to him for his work, the Forward Party has worked to repeatedly and obviously suppress and deny the existence of this historically significant coalition.

I plan to repeat this project in 2024 and many subsequent elections afterwards. Others may duplicate this work, but I ask you to beware of replacement activists. Another person, less committed to the ideals and more interested in personal power will be presented to replace any activist that starts to truly challenge the status quo. The leaders have too much to lose and will in desperation, eventually commit every atrocity they claim to stand against.
